





Being a good Romanian Immigrant

When you see someone for the first time to a lady you should kiss her hand.

- DON'T SPIT, THROW LITTER OR YOUR CHEWING GUM ON THE STREET.**
It falls on each individual to keep our streets clean and green, so feel free to use the bins whenever you have something to throw.
- DON'T TALK BADLY ABOUT PLACES AND PEOPLE AROUND YOU.**
Even if something isn't quite the way you like it—for example, the food, the people, the traffic, or the shops—don't make negative comments about the places or the people you come in contact with.
- KEEP YOUR VOICE DOWN AND YOUR CONVERSATIONS PRIVATE**
You might be excited or even stressed, but when you are on street, in churches or museums you should try to speak quietly. Nobody else wants to hear your cell phone conversation or your daily schedule. Pay attention to the people around you, and try to respect the space you share.
- KEEP EYE CONTACT**
Whenever you talk with somebody keep eye contact, do not talk over your shoulder, it is a sign of disrespect and dishonesty. Even if you are not interested in the subject you are talking it is common sense to listen actively or politely excuse yourself.
- RESPECT THE CULTURE AND THE ENVIRONMENT**
Romanian people are religious, mainly orthodox, they like wearing decent clothes, so if you do not see the locals wearing a certain type of clothing then it is probably not acceptable. Take cues from the people about what is appropriate behavior and what not.
- FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS THE FIRST TIME**
- KEEP YOUR OWN SEAT**
In our school students move around for each class (eg. English lab, Chemistry lab, etc) and each student has his/her own seat, so make sure you know your seat and who do.
- GREET THE TEACHER**
When teacher enters the classroom students stand up and greet the teacher.
- TAKE NOTES**
You are expected to take notes when the teacher tells you to, it is really important to keep a record of the daily lessons.
- DO YOUR HOMEWORK**
We have a lot of homework to do and each teacher has his/her own rules, you are expected to do daily homework for all subjects if you want to be successful and pass the national exams. Also, in Romania students are given numbers as grades: 10 is the best and 2 the least, 1 is always for cheating.




Beziehungen


Free-time Activities




Romania


